

## CIS 180 L - Intro to JavaScript - Fall 2006 Homework Assignment #5

**Purpose:** To practice with some JavaScript objects and their properties

1. Consider the following HTML page (also available from the public course web page, where you obtained this handout, under the name **hw5\_prob1.html**):

Add JavaScript to this HTML page so that, when you are done, you have displayed the value of at least one **document** or **navigator** or **history** of **location** object **property**.
