

CIS 450 - Short topic papers

During the time period of our presentations -- October 20th to November 1st -- each student not presenting during a given class day will write a short topic paper (as described below) on one of the topics for each class day (on the topic assigned to him/her below). Since there are four class days of presentations, then each student will have written three short topic papers by the end of student presentations on November 1st.

(As a couple of side-benefits, there will be at least a couple of students who should be especially prepared to ask informed questions about the topics of each of that day's presentations, and there will be at least a couple of additional viewpoints with regard to each topic on the course Moodle site for your eventual additional information.)

Here are the specifications:

- You should find an article related to the topic you are assigned.
- Write a paper of at least 300 words in which you:
 - summarize 4-6 of the most important points in the article
 - explain how the article relates to the assigned topic
 - explain how the article relates to IRM and/or KM and/or KMS
 - make sure you have at least two ample paragraphs containing the above requirements
 - begin the paper with one line containing your name, and the next line containing the topic and the title of the article you found relating to that topic
 - include a reference for the article you found:
 - If it is a reference from a journal or conference, include at least the title, the author(s), the name of the journal/conference, issue information and/or date, and page numbers.
 - If the reference is a web site, include at least the specific URL and the title of that page; include author(s) and date if you can tell what they are, but I know that isn't always evident from a web site.
 - If the reference is a book, include at least the title, author, publisher, and date of publication.
 - (If you are referencing a journal or book via the ACM Digital Library or other library resource, please include that fact along with the above information, as that would be helpful to a classmate to know that they, too, could access that resource from that same source.)
 - use complete sentences; use spell-checking to remove typos and misspellings; use reasonable grammar. Proofread your paper before you submit it.
- By the beginning of class on the class day for that topic, send me an e-mail with:
 - a **Subject** : line of **CIS 450 - short topic paper**
 - a PDF version of your paper-plus-reference (as an attachment)

- NOTE that your paper will be posted to the course Moodle site, and we may do some class activities with these papers later in the semester.
